Principal's Report, presented by Tracey Arbuthnott, Principal, Glen Allan Elementary

- The school has been very busy over the last four weeks.
 - Grade 6s have written the English Part A Provincial Achievement Test on May 11.
 - We have completed staffing for one teaching position and one office secretary position for next year. There may be more staffing to come depending on the domino effect. Mrs. Barr and Mrs. Blackwell are retiring this year.
 - Spring budget is here and we have been working on it making sure that we put the needs of our students first and foremost. We were able to keep three classrooms for each grade next year. \$3,100,683 with 3% supplies and materials and 97% to staffing costs.



- As usual, all three of our temporary EAs are going to be let go and we are hoping to rehire them again with the fall budget. We were able to keep all seven of our permanent classified EAs.
- We have a large cohort of PALS students transitioning to our Kindergarten next year. Supports for Students has funded a second Educational Assistant for that program to help support those students.
- Teachers raised concerns with the Mathathon material, stress placed on the student, clear instructions, amount of time for the test, manipulatives, and grade level appropriateness of the math being done. The needs of Special Needs students need to be considered as they are not necessarily at that grade level.
 - Recommendation: material should be at a practice level and not an instructional level.
 - **ACTION:** work with Principal before hand to allow teachers to review content prior to the Mathathon to ensure it's appropriate to the grade level and what is being learned in the classroom.

Teacher's Report, presented by Stacey Robinson, teacher, Glen Allan Elementary

- Classrooms have been participating in many field trips this past month.
- Students are excited for the upcoming track meet.
- Student Council has been working hard at selling Smencils to raise funds for new gym equipment. Where the funds were being spent was the decision of members of Student Council.
- Miss Gauthier has been busy with new initiatives to allow students to earn extra points for their society.
- Instead of just a garbage pick up around the school, all grades have been involved in a bird feeder project which has been received very well.

School Trustee Report, presented by Lynn Patterson, School Trustee

- Encouraged parents to visit <u>www.eips.ca</u> and complete a survey regarding the Alberta Education curriculum.
- New school build update
 - Elementary school in Davidson Creek is on schedule; the School Board is in the process of making a decision regarding the name.
 - Wye Elementary School will be replaced by a new school located in Heritage Hills. There is talk of the school being up to grade 9. An open house is planned for June 14 from 6:30 – 8:30 p.m. at Wye School.

 - Jenn has touched base with Tara Spence (school dance) regarding the changes needed in concession food available and the need to have a custodian on site throughout the duration of the dance. These changes need to be reflected in the next budget.

- Candy Mudry will coordinate the volunteer sign up sheets again next year. In 2019, we will need new coordinators for the BBQ and Cake Walk.
- Michelle is working on the Staff Appreciation lunch, June 13.
- **ACTION:** Irene to touch base with Tracey to discuss healthy initiatives for the hot lunch program next year.
- Pam discussed the BBQ and noted that things are running smoothly. Save On Foods in Summerwood has been gracious with their donations again this year.
 ACTION: Pam to connect with Mary for volunteer list.

- Silent Auction: Thank you ad in Sherwood News last week. Still waiting on the bill for that. Chandel was going to call them about it.
- Math-a-thon: Natisha has first total/deposit done. So far we have \$9005.45.
 There is still around \$2000 outstanding. She sent me these numbers at 11:00 last night so we haven't figured out prizes yet.
- Art Card: Pricing from Paperstuff has actually gone down from the last time we ordered. St. Paul will order with us again, but only required 3,000.
