2. Glen Allan Parent Survey Results

- The results for the 2023-24 EIPS Parent Survey conducted in March have been shared with the school. Thank you to all families who took the time to share their feedback with the Division.
- There were 49 parents responded from Glen Allan, significantly lower than last few years where between 80-100 parents responded.
- The survey results for Glen Allan have helped us identify the following areas of strength and opportunities for growth.
 - Areas of strength: Growth in literacy and numeracy, understanding of First Nations, Metis and Inuit culture and history, student citizenship, safe and caring schools, parent involvement and communication
 - Opportunities for growth: Meeting student needs and access to resources, quality of education, school discipline
- The feedback gathered in the survey will help our school and the Division measure its progress toward meeting the priorities and goals outlined in the EIPS Four-Year Education Plan and develop strategies to better serve students and the wider community moving forward.

all students will demonstrate growth as measured by the STAR literacy assessment, teacher observations, common writing assessments administered in October 2024, January 2025 and May 2025, and on student progress reports in December 2024, March, and June 2025.

- SEP Goal 3: By building capacity for all staff to continue implementing high-leverage instructional strategies, specifically incorporating daily number sense activities into math classes, all students will demonstrate growth in number sense as indicated by STAR Math, teacher observations, and on student progress reports in December 2024, March, and June 2025.

- Submitted our balanced Budget for next year Allocations are based on student enrollment, inclusive education and complexity funding, and early learning funding. Budget for next year is 2.16 million dollars – 95% of which is staffing

Class Placements

- As the survey results also indicate, Glen Allan Elementary is genuinely concerned for the welfare and success of your children.
- One of our goals is to maintain well-balanced classrooms while making the best use of the resources available to us. We sometimes need to group students together in particular ways in order to provide extra supports for their learning needs.
- Aside from academic needs, we also take into consideration how to balance social, emotional, and behavioural needs in each group.
- Our teams have the opportunity to see how your child interacts with others while at school and they use their collective professional judgment in determining how to place your child in a group that they feel will best benefit their growth. Classroom placements are the result of many conversations between all the teachers in a grade level, our counsellor and the administration team.
- We ask for your support in allowing teachers to develop next year's grouping in the fairest way possible.
- In the last two BUZZ blog posts there has been an article related to Class Placements, providing an opportunity for families to make class requests for extenuating circumstances. The deadline to submit those requests by email to the principal is Friday, May 31.
