Chair update

Erin Hamilton

- Playground/grant update – grant approval hopefully Friday; cheque to be made out to the County (one from GASC, one from matching grant); bids are currently out, to be completed by end of February for review by playground committee; Assurance review meeting provided connections/ideas to help connect with County and wards to help with some playground items like accessibility.
- Casino status update – working with AGLC in regards to by-laws and miscommunication regarding updates; deadline of May to stay in the cycle.
- Call for November GASC email content – call for volunteers for Winter Showcase (decorators, helpers, etc), plug for Fund Development Chair vacancy upcoming next year (mentor over the year vs just jumping in)

- 50/50 timing – tabled until January

Budget Vice-Chair update

- ~115 yearbooks sold

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- BBQ amount, candy canes coming out of operating budget
- Hot lunch website fee to be paid at end of school year from operating account; profits pay for expenses
- Did not pay entire school request as 50/50 sales will pay the rest
- Casino will not be considered in budget until confirmed
- Erin Hamilton to ask if there are alternative playground payment methods to cheques

Programs update

Caitlin Burkholder, Vice Chair

- Yearbook sales – ~115 yearbooks sales to date; plan to open another week of sales in early January if needed.
- Winter showcase treats – Candy canes were a hit to do again; funds available from Food/BBQ budget
- Front row seat raffle/contest – instead of paid raffle, use Food Bank donation as entry into raffle (1 entry max per student regardless of number of items); GASC to build ballot and announcement for the Buzz to send to the school for printing; seating concern – could there be a “sibling room” so families can utilize another seat? GASC email for parent volunteers to mind siblings of students currently enrolled in the school

4. Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) Board of Trustees report (10 minutes)

Trina Boymook – presented by Erin Hamilton

- The Board reviewed the 4027 respondents to the School Calendar Survey at our October 31 Caucus meeting. The Superintendent is using survey responses to inform her recommendation, along with research, to develop her recommendation to the Board who will debate at our December meeting.
- The Leveraging student achievement funds will be used to address literacy and numeracy interventions at selected junior high schools. A portion of the funds will also be used for targeted supports for elementary French Immersion.
- At the end of October, the Board sent a letter to the Minister of Education to provide feedback on the Weighted Moving Average (WMA) funding model. The way the WMA model works, funding does not align with the needs of current students in schools where growth either remains level or has grown significantly. We requested that we funded for the students that we currently have in the classrooms. The new funding formula takes into account classroom complexity, inflation, technology infrastructure, as well as the security of online PAT/DIP. We suggested that rural school divisions with declining enrolment receive short term bridge funding. The Minister did share with a meeting with Board Chairs and Superintendent, that changes to the funding



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model would be released with the upcoming budget announcement.

- a. Our Fall Scholastic Book Fair was a huge success!
- b. Thank you to all families, teachers, and students who participated, supporting our school while enhancing home libraries. Your investment in your reader helped our school to earn new books for our school and classroom libraries. These resources greatly benefit our students.
- c. Our school's total sales were \$7145.49. We will have approximately \$3300 to spend on books, \$1500 of which we've already received. We also purchased 1 book for each Teacher from their Classroom Wish lists to add to their classroom libraries.
